

TRAVELLING GUIDELINES

FROM INDIA TO NEPAL

Nepal is open to both vaccinated and unvaccinated travellers. However, vaccinated individuals can bypass the testing rules that require travellers to provide proof of a negative coronavirus test taken no more than 72 hours before travel.

- 1) Testing: Negative PCR test results required for all countries. Passengers must have a negative COVID-19 test result taken at most 72 hours before departure from the first embarkation point. Tests accepted are GeneXpert, NAAT and RT-PCR.
- 2) Passengers must obtain Printed copy of International Traveller Online Arrival Form obtained after registration in https://ccmc.gov.np/arms/person_add_en.php
- 3) Passengers must have a hotel reservation confirmation.
- 4) Passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival.
- 5) Visa on arrival facilities restarted for eligible passengers with a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival.

Movement Restrictions: There are no restrictions on movements within Nepal. Local and private transportation are available. Public transport and personal vehicles, including taxis, are permitted in the Kathmandu valley and must adhere to strict COVID protocols. All persons within Nepal are subject to current health protocols, including restrictions on large gatherings. Violations of local orders may result in penalties. Additional restrictions remain possible in many locations. Check local conditions before travelling.

Quarantine Information: All fully-vaccinated international travellers are not required to quarantine

All non-vaccinated / semi-vaccinated travellers must quarantine for 10 days in a hotel at their own cost. A post-quarantine negative PCR test result is required before onward travel is permitted.

All travellers may be subject to random checks.

FROM NEPAL TO INDIA

- 1) Passengers must have a negative COVID-19 test result taken at most 48 hours before departure from the first embarkation point.
- 2) Air Suvidha Self Declaration Form To be Mandatorily Filled By All International Arriving Passengers to India (Applications are being accepted on behalf of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India) <https://www.newdelhiairport.in/airsuvidha/apho-registration>

- 1) Passport Copy in PDF format (The maximum upload size is 1MB)
- 2) RT-PCR Negative Certificate in PDF format (The maximum upload size is 1MB)
- 3) Vaccination Certificate in PDF format (The maximum upload size is 1MB)
